INSPIRED TO SERVE

Beverly and Allan Everist epitomize the word "service." During 60 years of marriage they have partnered to serve their country, community, church, children, clients and each other. In recognition of their humble and heartfelt outreach efforts, the Presbytery of the Grand Canyon honored the Everists with the 2019 Senior Service Award.

Native Iowans, Beverly and Allan met in high school. They married once Beverly completed nursing school and Allan began two years as a U.S. Army officer after college. Allan had a 30-year career in the Farm Credit banking system, in charge of offices in four states in the Midwest and Kentucky. Beverly was a career surgical nurse. The couple raised a son and daughter, who both live in Colorado with the Everists' three grandchildren. Despite several moves, careers and family responsibilities, the Everists always made time to serve.

Retiring in Colorado, Beverly and Allan became part-time Scottsdale residents in 1995, and full-time Terraviva residents a few years later. After "church shopping," they found a home at Pinnacle. They've ushered at Sunday services and for the Pinnacle Concert Series, where Bev – in charge of concert ushers – loves to hear concertgoers "ooh and aah about our beautiful Sanctuary, organ and music program." They are members of the Act II Cancer Support Group, and participate in SAGE and Amigos. Perhaps they are best known for their "intake" role at the annual Rummage Sale, where they spend long hours preparing the event.

"You never know what you're going to find when you open boxes left by donors – from Hladin figurines and oil paintings to ashtrays full of cigarette butts. The teens are a big help, and even put down their phones to help us organize the donations," Beverly

says with a smile. "It's particularly rewarding to see some of the shoppers find bargains on things they need. One man was overwhelmed when we gave him a good deal on a bag of ballcaps; he even wrote us a thank you note."

Beyond Pinnacle, the Everists have served the community in impressive ways. Beverly helped organize the volunteer office after Mayo Hospital opened, then volunteered in its Surgical Department. When HonorHealth Thompson Peak opened in 2007, they were among the first volunteers – Allan at the front desk and Beverly in the Surgical Department. As lifelong golfers, they've volunteered at many Waste Management Phoenix Open tournaments, working with the pro golfers' caddies. Beverly co-chaired a cookbook project that benefited junior golf in Arizona.

The Everists encourage others, particularly those new to Scottsdale, to get involved. "Put yourself out there. We need more people to volunteer, and it's so easy to get involved at Pinnacle and in Scottsdale. The rewards are numerous when you get involved in

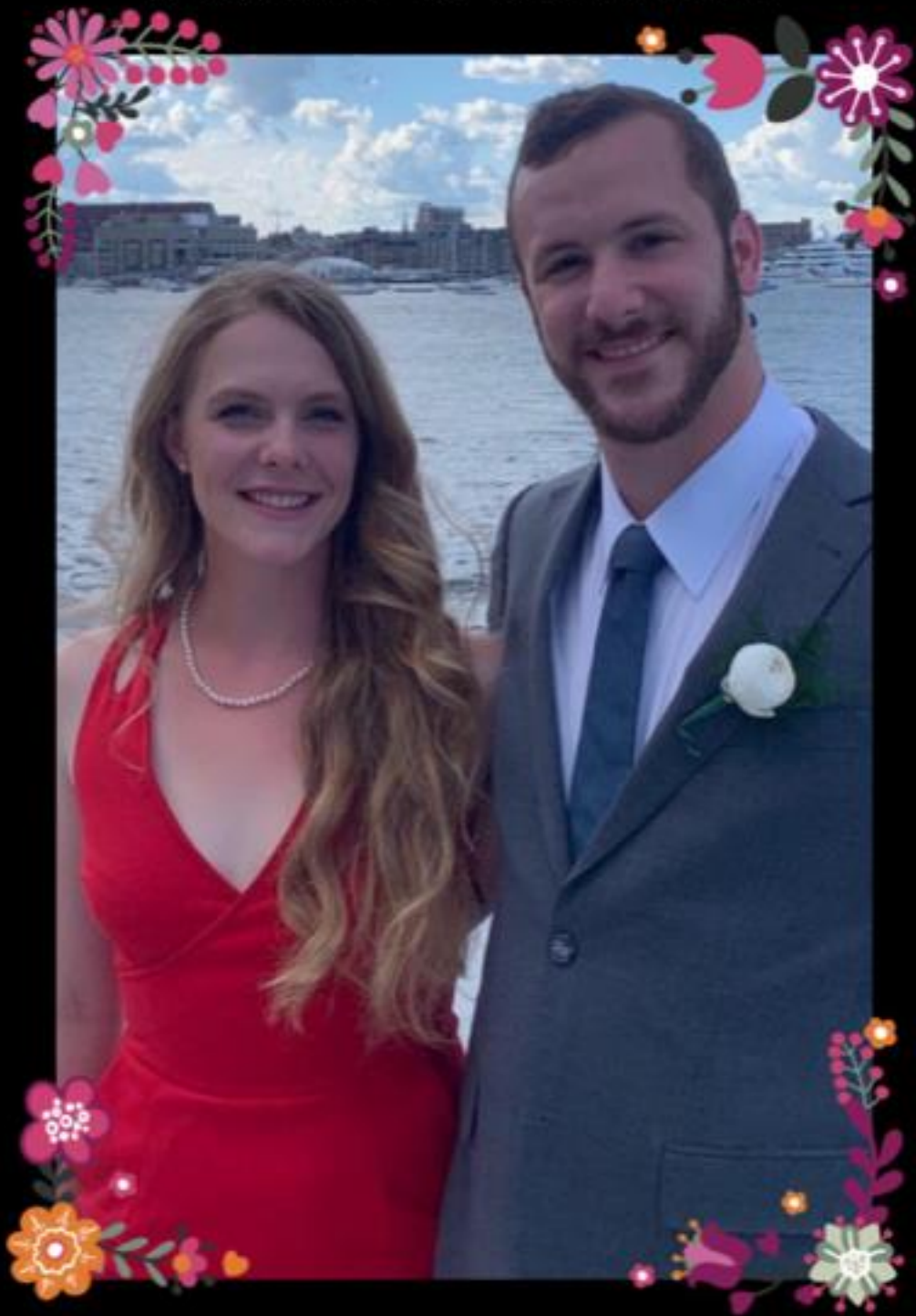

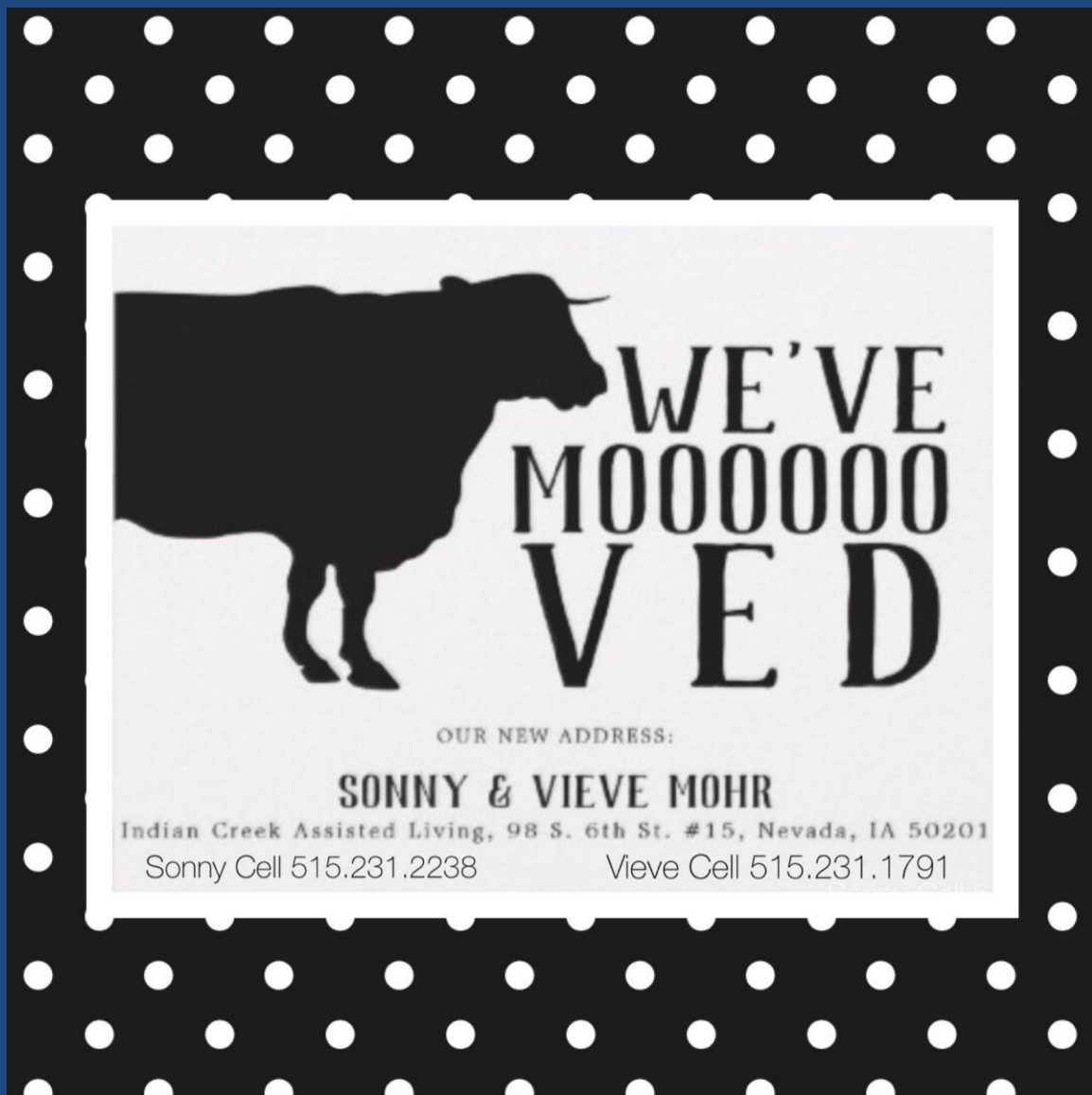
